## Chudar invited to the CII- UNICEF Regional Summit

Dr. A Ravishankar Founder & CEO of Chudar was invited to speak at the UNICEF Regional Summit on Quality & Sustainable Education held by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) on 18th July 2019. Inspired by the United Nations SDG Goal 4, the event generated a dialogue on quality education. The conference converged education stakeholders within academia, policy advocacy, educational development implementation, and others.

Dr. Ravishankar spoke on "Complexities of Execution of Quality Education Agenda," as one of the panelists. He put forth the challenges in reforming the rote memorization approach prevalent in the system and its significance in ensuring quality education, while explaining how Chudar is working towards breaking these shackles by building confidence in children through conceptual learning as well as aligning the goals to the needs of the present curriculum in Tamilnadu schools.





## Chudar joins hands with Government Schools in Thiruporur to improve quality.

The Government Partnership Program for this academic year kick started on 24th July with Chudar representatives visiting the Block Resource Centre in Thiruporur and initiating Government teachers into the Chudar Program. Teachers from 15 Schools across the block participated in the one day training. During the training, Chudar representatives relayed the overbearing stress students undergo to excel in school, an issue escalated by the ultimate ineffectiveness of rote-memorization skills. Activity kits would instead enhance critical conceptual skills.

While speaking about the program's past results, representatives acknowledged specific teachers and people in the room for their impact on the program. Chudar then awarded the teachers from schools that exhibited the most improvement in the students' performance of the previous year.
