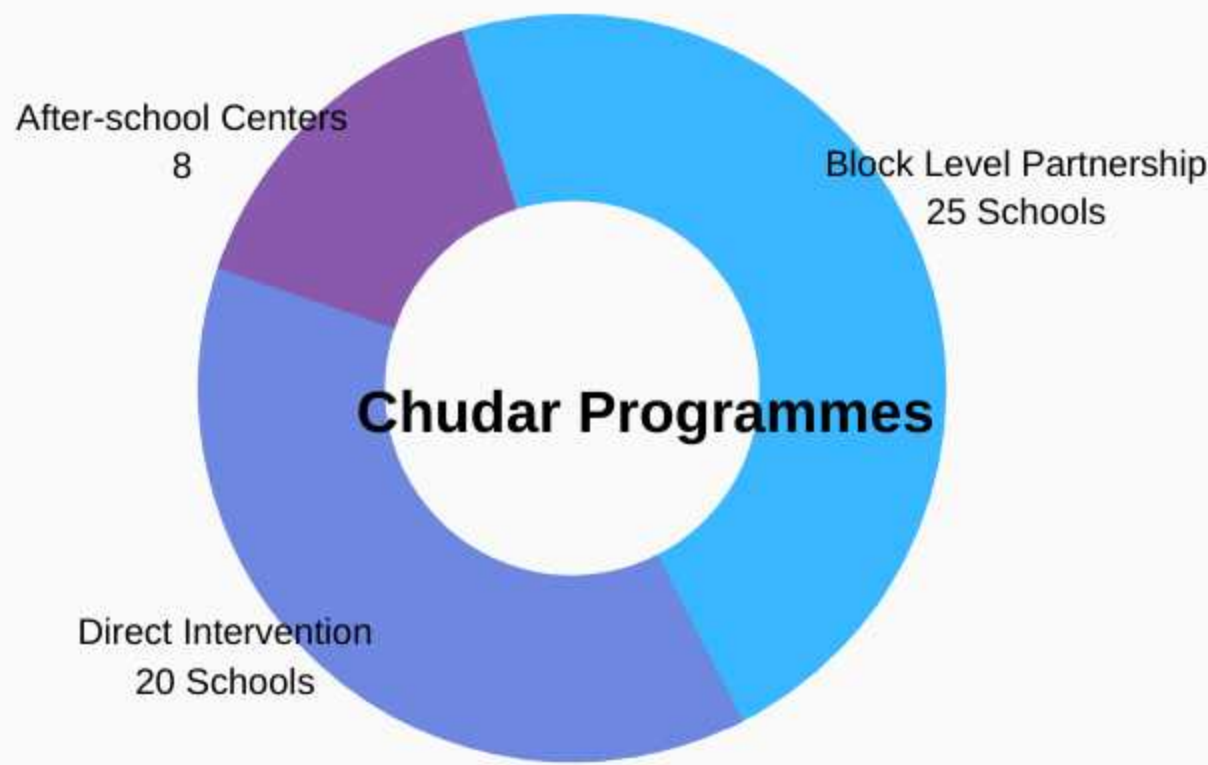

Junk Art Event!

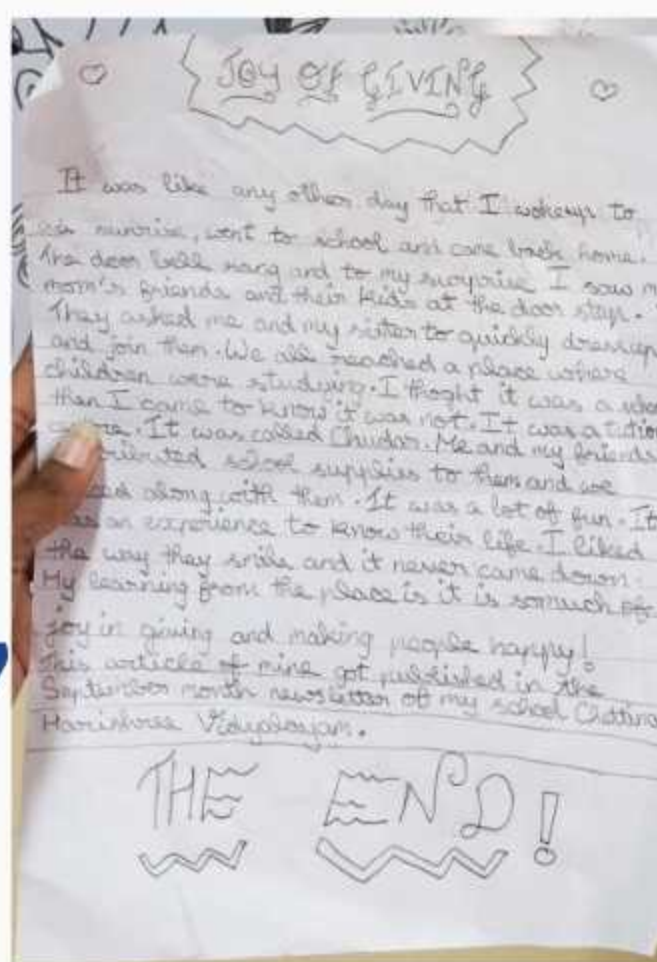

I used to conduct tuition classes at my house in this same neighborhood initially. I remember rejecting this boy with a learning disability because I was inexperienced to teach him. The parents also gave up because no tutor they approached would accept him. When I joined Chudar Education Center, I noticed the boy here. I started teaching him like the rest of the students with the help of Chudar's monthly training. Even though I didn't understand the importance of the training initially, I still followed through the methods and skills taught. Exactly after 3 months, when there was a sudden visit from one of the staff, the boy didn't hesitate to answer a mathematical sum when called to the front, and he did it all correctly to my surprise! That moment was totally unexpected and I don't think I've ever felt prouder!"
